

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## The global fisheries crisis

Challenging official discourse based on wrong statistics through reconstruction of past ecosystem states and catches:

- quantifying huge errors in catch figures reported by governments to FAO (1)
- **demarginalising** 'small-scale' fishers (>90% employment), the men and women engaged
- revealing illegal, unreported and unregulated (IUU) fisheries, forced labour in the industry
- concomitant attention to the economic, institutional and (under-researched) social dimensions.

## **SSF Guidelines**

Were adopted by the FAO's Committee of Fisheries in 2014 after three years of extensive bottom-up consultations. Their implementation has only started, but could, if accelerated, make a useful contribution towards the Sustainable Development Goals, particularly SDG 14, and obvious links to SDGs

- 1. no poverty,
- 2. zero hunger,
- 5. gender equality,
- 8. decent work and economic growth,
- 12. responsible production and consumption

The SSF Guidelines will succeed best, if SDG 17 as an essential cross-cutting issue is acted upon: partnerships for the goals.
